VERMONT VOTER REGISTRATION INFORMATION

(HOW TO FILL OUT THE "APPLICATION FOR ADDITION TO THE CHECKLIST")

To be eligible to vote in Vermont you must: (Eligibility requirements are in 17 V.S.A. § 2121, 2122)

1. be a citizen of the United States;
2. be 18 years of age or older, or will be eighteen on the day of election;
3. be a resident of Vermont and a resident of the town in which you apply to be added to the checklist;
4. take, or have previously taken, the Voter's Oath.

If you are registering for the first time in Vermont, and you mail this application to your town clerk individually, you must submit a photocopy of one of the following forms of identification: current & valid photo identification, bank statement, utility bill, or government document that contains your name and current address.

Where to File: **Keep the goldenrod copy for yourself**, and submit the other three copies to the Town or City Clerk where you reside. Addresses are in the Town Clerk's Guide on the Secretary of State's web site, <http://www.sec.state.vt.us>, click "Elections" then the quick links on the right or call your town clerk.

When to File: The application must be received by 12:00 noon on the second Monday before the day of an election in order to vote in that election. Every town clerk's office is open from 10:00 a.m. to 12:00 noon on this Monday. If this Monday is a legal holiday for the State of Vermont, you can submit your application to the Town Clerk until 12:00 noon on the Tuesday prior to the election. If you apply through the Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV) or another voter registration agency, your application must be postmarked or accepted before the second Monday before the election.

Getting on the Voter Checklist: You are not automatically registered to vote by filing this application. If the Town Clerk (or the Board of Civil Authority) finds that you meet the eligibility requirements you will be added to the checklist and become a registered voter. You will be notified in writing whether or not your application has been approved. If you have not received notification within 1 month of filing the application or by the week before the election, call your town clerk. If you are not eligible, the Board must state the reason in writing and give you a chance to be reconsidered. If you are still denied, you can appeal in writing informally to a superior or district judge in your county. (No filing fee or lawyer is required.)

Voter's Oath: If you have previously voted in Vermont, do not take the voter's oath again. If not, take the oath in front of a person authorized to administer oaths. (Any notary public, town clerk, justice of the peace, or any person authorized to administer oaths in Vermont.) If you do not take oaths you may take it as an affirmation. Be sure you sign the oath and that the official completes the certification. If the filing deadline is close, you can file your application without taking the oath, and take the oath on Election Day. If you request an early/absentee ballot, you must take the oath before requesting the ballot.

SERIOUS PENALTIES FOR FALSE INFORMATION ON AN APPLICATION TO THE CHECKLIST

It is unlawful to give false information concerning your qualifications to be a registered voter of a town or city in Vermont. The penalties are serious, including penalties of up to a \$10,000 fine or imprisonment for not more than fifteen years, or both.

Note to Town and City Clerks: The applicant retains the goldenrod copy when the application is completed. After the Town Clerk or Board of Civil Authority acts, complete the bottom of the application form and distribute as follows:

White Copy (Top original) -- Town Clerk retains. **Canary Copy** -- Mail to applicant after indicating action taken

Pink Copy -- Mail to place where applicant was previously registered to vote.

The laws relating to voter registration are in 17 V. S. A. §§2121-2150. If you have questions, call your town clerk or call the Elections Division, Office of the Secretary of State at (802) 828-2363, or (in Vermont) (800) 439-8683.

Note: If you were provided this form by a voter registration agency, you may decline to register. If you decline to register your failure to register will remain confidential and will be used only for voter registration purposes. The fact that you may have submitted this application through a voter registration agency will remain confidential and will be used only for voter registration purposes.
